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ECONOMIC

Industry Growth Program

Agency: Australian Government- Business

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility: Innovative small and medium enterprises undertaking commercialisation and/or growth projects within the National Reconstruction Fund (NRF) priority areas:

- value-add in resources
- value-add in agriculture, forestry and fisheries
- transport
- medical science
- renewables and low emissions technologies
- defence capability
- enabling capabilities.

The program supports innovative small and medium enterprises undertaking commercialisation and/or growth projects within the National Reconstruction Fund priority areas through advisory services and opportunities for matched grant funding. Minor changes or improvements to existing products or services are not considered innovative.

The successful applicants will be connected to an Industry Growth Program Adviser who will provide tailored advice to support commercialisation and/or growth project.

Once this advice has been received, it is possible to apply for:

- grants of \$50,000 to \$250,000 to support early-stage commercialisation projects
- grants of \$100,000 to \$5 million for commercialisation and growth projects.

Seed Start Program

Agency: Australian Government – Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications and the Arts

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility:

- be a company incorporated in Australia with an active Australian Business Number (ABN)
- be a non-tax-exempt business
- be registered for goods and services tax (GST)
- have an annual turnover of less than \$1 million for each of the 3 financial years prior to the lodgement of their application
- be based or willing to be based in SA prior to commencing the project.

The Seed-Start program provides financial support for early-stage and high-growth potential businesses in South Australia. Eligible start-ups can apply for funding to assist with the cost of commercialising a product or service that is unique and has a sustainable competitive advantage in national and international markets. Two different funding types are available, depending on each business' stage of development:

- Seed Grants: Minimum \$50,000, maximum \$100,000
- Start Grants: Minimum \$100,001, maximum \$500,000

Regional Precincts and Partnerships Program

Agency: Australian Government – Department of Industry Science and Resources

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility: Australian State/Territory Government agency or body, an Australian local government agency or body/ a Regional University, an incorporated not-for-profit organisation

Selection Process Non-competitive (applicants will be assessed on their individual merit against the assessment criteria, and will not be compared to other applications)

The program will focus on a partnership approach to deliver investment in regional Australia. It will bring together governments and communities to plan and deliver regional precincts that are tailored to local needs and have a shared vision in how that precinct connects to the region. Partners can be from government, First Nations groups, community organisations, educational institutions, or private enterprise.

Regional precincts or 'places with a purpose' are user-defined geographic areas with a specific shared need or theme. Regional precincts may include business districts, neighbourhoods, activity centres, commercial hubs or community and recreational areas. They will be located in renewal areas and growth areas in regional centres, regional corridors, regional cities, as well as smaller town centres that serve as service hubs in more remote communities.

STREAM 1 funding amounts

Precinct Development and Planning

- The minimum grant amount is \$500,000.
- The maximum grant amount is \$5 million.

The grant amount will be up to 100 per cent of the eligible expenditure for the project to a maximum amount of \$5 million.

STREAM 2 funding amounts:

Shovel ready project

- The minimum grant amount is \$5 million.
- The maximum grant amount is \$50 million.

The grant amount will be up to 100 per cent of the eligible expenditure for the project to a maximum amount of \$50 million.

PRIMARY PRODUCTION

Connecting Communities Events

Agency: Government of South Australia - Department of Primary Industries and Regions (PIRSA)

Closing: 31 January 2026 or when funding is exhausted

Eligibility:

- farmer groups, including Agricultural Bureau branches and farming systems groups
- industry organisations
- community groups such as agricultural show societies, progress associations, sports clubs, service clubs
- local government.

PIRSA is offering the Connecting Communities Events Grant as part of the Family and Business Support Program to support rural communities in South Australia affected by drought and other adversity. The aim of this program is to support gatherings that encourage communities to come together, share experiences, and reinforce the unity and strength of rural areas. Events must be held by no later than 31 December 2026

Grants of up to \$5,000 are available to industry, community, not-for-profit, local government and incorporated groups to host events that foster social connections and provide support during these times.

On Drought Infrastructure Rebate Scheme

Agency: Government of South Australia - Department of Primary Industries and Regions

Closing: When funds are exhausted

Eligibility: Primary Producers

The Government of South Australia is offering a rebate of up to 75% to primary producers for implementing eligible on-farm infrastructure that enhances drought management and preparedness.

The On-Farm Drought Infrastructure Rebate Scheme aims to assist primary producers in implementing infrastructure projects that assist with managing current drought conditions and strengthen preparedness for future droughts.

Successful applicants must be able to cover the full cost of the infrastructure and will be reimbursed through the grant for 75% of the total cost up to a maximum grant of \$5,000 GST exclusive. Applicants must contribute at least 25% of the total infrastructure cost. Other government funding, including grants, concessional loans, or insurance claim funds, cannot be used towards the applicant's contribution.

Pre-approval of eligible activities for which costs are yet to be incurred may be obtained to provide certainty of receiving funding. Pre-approved activities must be completed within six months of the written pre-approval date.

The rebate is available for infrastructure activities that enhance drought management and preparedness:

- Costs associated with setting up or improving stock containment areas.

- Costs associated with the purchase and installation or upgrading of efficient water systems for irrigation.
- Costs associated with improving water infrastructure for livestock management.
- Costs associated with the adoption of technologies for improved drought management.
- Costs associated for labour of an external contractor to install, and repair or replace infrastructure set out in the eligible activities.

Only one application per ABN will be accepted.

Red Wine Grape Grower Support Grants

Agency: Government of South Australia – Department of Primary Industries and Regions

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility: Growers who rely on agriculture for their primary source of income and derive 30% or more of their income from red wine grapes.

Wine grape growers across the state who are experiencing challenges due to the current oversupply of red wine grapes will be able to access additional support through Rural Business Support.

The support aims to alleviate stress for grape growers, who have felt significant impacts owing to market disruption, severe weather events and natural disasters.

Amount: Immediate grants will be available of up to \$1,500 to accommodate routine costs. This will be in conjunction with business financial counselling.

COMMUNITY

Community Sheds Grants



Agency: Human Services – Government of South Australia

Closing: 19 June 2025

Eligibility:

- Aboriginal Community-Controlled Organisations (ACCO)
- Not-for-profit organisations

A Community Shed can be a purpose-built facility, a multipurpose community building, or shared space used on a regular basis for the purpose of shed like activities and may:

- Make a variety of products including toys, household, or garden furniture, Indigenous arts and crafts, wood turned articles or textiles
- Undertake activities that may include gardening, wood turning, metalwork, repairs or restoration, bicycle and small engine maintenance, cooking, or nutrition demonstrations.
- Undertake community projects if desired.
- Participate in training programs such as first aid and computers/IT.

Grants are available for the following activities:

- Capital works for existing sheds
- Tools, Equipment and Occupational Health and Safety Measures
- Resources for communal spaces including kitchens to support participation
- Community Food Gardens
- Support for Volunteer recruitment and development
- Mentoring and Knowledge Sharing

Single grants of up to \$30,000 are available.

AGT Community Donations



Agency: Australian Grain Technology

Closing: 31 May 2025

Eligibility: Anyone who has grown an AGT variety under AGT Variety Licence Agreement, completed harvest declarations for the years 2020-2023 inclusive, and paid end point royalties on their harvest.

The donation can be used to cover all or part of the community project.

It can be anything from repairs or maintenance of community facilities, educational opportunities for local youth, or even purchasing a new tuba for the brass band.

Youth Action Plan Life Skills



Agency: Human Services – Government of South Australia

Closing: 4 June 2025

Eligibility:

- Local councils
- Aboriginal Community-Controlled Organisations
- Not-for-profits and social enterprises

One-off grants of up to \$15,000 are available for eligible organisations working directly with young people that are in metropolitan and regional South Australia, with a target of 50% of grants being provided to rural and regional SA.

- The funding will help create or expand programs that teach essential life skills, including:
- Navigating government services (e.g., applying for birth certificates, Medicare cards, and Tax File Numbers)
- Resume building, job applications, and interview preparation
- Healthy lifestyle choices, nutrition, and the impact of diet
- Financial literacy, budgeting, and debt management
- Practical skills such as car maintenance, meal prep, and basic home upkeep
- Learner's license driving programs for young people from priority groups

Villa Dalmacia Grants Program



Agency: Villa Dalmacia

Closing: 31 May 2025

Eligibility: Individuals and organisations serving the community, with a focus on those benefiting southern European backgrounds or addressing broad community needs.

Grants are available for projects that:

- **Support Community Projects:** Fund projects that enhance community welfare, health, education, and cultural heritage.
- **Promote Social Inclusion:** Address social isolation, particularly among elderly and culturally diverse communities.
- **Enhance Cultural Heritage:** Support activities that preserve and celebrate southern European culture.

Qantas Regional Grants



Agency: Qantas

Closing: 10 May 2025

Eligibility: individual, group or not-for-profit organisation

The Qantas Regional Grants program offers \$2 million in support to Australian-based communities and projects that are looking to benefit the country's regional areas. The grants are a mixture of cash grants, flights in kind and marketing support

Applicants had to nominate the value of each grant component required for their work and clearly outline how it would be used to further their regional cause.

There is no maximum or minimum allocation – this is entirely at the discretion of the panel.

Examples of eligible applicants:

- A teacher applying for funds to create a playground at the local school.
- A sporting club looking for flight funding to support a domestic trip to a competitive competition.
- An event organiser applying to promote their event to a broader audience in collaboration with Qantas.
- A charity looking to expand their program into regional areas (eg breast cancer trucks visiting regional towns).

Elders Community Giving Grants

Agency: Qantas

Closing: 15 May 2025

Eligibility: not-for-profit organisation located in a regional area

The Community Giving Project grants are intended for high impact community initiatives. Applicants must be based in Australia, in a regional, rural or remote setting and in an area in which Elders, or Elders owned business operates.

Elders supports initiatives that provide sustainable, tangible and long-term benefits with positive outcomes for communities at a grassroots level, further building capacity, longevity, liveability and connection in our regions.

Structured across six distinct pillars (referred to as the 'Community Giving Project Pillars') with a focus on sustainability, innovation, wellbeing, diversity, and safety, Elders will offer grants up to \$20,000. There is a seventh pillar called the People's Choice, which will offer two additional grants of up to \$10,000 each.

2025 Waterloo Wind Farm Community Grants Program (CEF)

Agency: Waterloo Wind Farm

Closing: 12 May 2025

Eligibility: Community and Not for Profit Organisations close to Waterloo Wind Farm

Locally based organisations addressing issues in the Mid North region area are encouraged to apply. Emphasis will be placed on towns or projects closest to the Waterloo Wind Farm.

To be considered for funding, activities should address at least one or more of these areas:

- Building community pride
- Diversity
- Benefiting the environment
- Supporting the local economy

Total funding pool available \$30,000. Maximum amount is not specified at this time.

SilverChef Community Grant

Agency: SilverChef

Closing:

Round 3: Applications open 1 January - 31 March

Round 4: Applications open 1 April - 30 June

Eligibility: Non-For-Profit organisations

The SilverChef Community Grants Program is open to registered charities and not-for-profits that use hospitality or food service to support communities in need.

Four grants worth \$5,000 each are awarded each quarter globally. To be eligible, applicants should receive limited funding from other sources, have a clear and specific need for commercial kitchen equipment, and have been a registered charity or NFP for a minimum of 12 months.

Each \$5,000 grant is a 75:25 mix of equipment and cash.

Variety SA Organisation/Community Grant

Agency: Variety the Children's Charity

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility: Community organisation

Assistance is available for organisations supporting South Australian children aged up to 18 years of age, who are sick, disadvantaged or living with disability. To apply for assistance, you must be able to demonstrate a genuine need (including financial evidence) and information on how the assistance requested will meet this need.

A strong application will demonstrate the following:

- Unmet need i.e. it cannot be met through the organisation's own funding, through government or other organisation funding; and
- Direct benefit to the children in the care of the organisation.

To support community and sporting organisations with the purchase of AEDs, Preventive Health SA is providing grants of \$1,000 per eligible location. All not-for-profit community or sporting organisations are invited to apply.

ABC Future Fund

Agency: ABC Foundation Ltd

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility: Aboriginal organisations with an ABN from remote and regional areas.

Funding is available for projects aligned with the Future Fund focus areas, such as On-Country Education, On-Country Care, and On-Country Research & Development.

The fund also offers small one-off event grants of up to \$2,500 per applicant for community-centred activities.

Inclusive Neighbourhoods

Agency: Julia Farr McLeod Benevolent Fund

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility: Social purpose organisations (including not-for-profits, social enterprises, universities and governments) who demonstrate an existing commitment to inclusion through engagement of people with disability in recognised roles in governance and/or workforce.

This grant funds initiatives by organisations that develop policy or practice relating to the inclusion of people living with disability.

Grants can be used for

- Salaries and on costs
- Costs of setting up your project, such as recruitment and training
- General operating costs directly related to the project
- Organisation overheads related to the project

- Honoraria/gifts for people participating in the program, for example in governance, codesign, or advisory groups
- Event costs
- Marketing costs
- Monitoring and evaluation
- Capital costs to support project delivery (e.g. laptops etc, rather than fixed assets)

Amount: Grants ranged in size between \$8,000 and \$230,000 in 2022- 2023. Multi-year grants can be made available, up to a maximum of three years.

VETERANS

Saluting Their Service



Agency: Department of Veterans' Affairs – Australian Government

Closing: 31 August 2025

Eligibility:

- Company
- Cooperative
- Corporate State or Territory Entity
- Incorporated Association
- Indigenous Corporation
- Local Government
- Non-corporate State or Territory Entity
- Non-corporate State or Territory Statutory Authority
- Partnership
- Person
- Sole Trader
- Statutory Entity
- Unincorporated Association – grant activities up to \$10,000 only.

The objective of the program is to commemorate the service and sacrifice of Australia's service personnel who served in wars, conflicts and peace operations, including National Service personnel, and their families.

The intended outcome of the program is to provide funding for projects and activities that:

- promote appreciation and understanding of the experiences of service, and the role of service personnel
- preserve, add to the sum of knowledge on, or provide access to information about Australia's wartime heritage.

There are 2 categories of grants available under the program:

1. Community Grants (STS-CG)

Grants up to \$10,000 are available for local, community-based projects and activities.

2. Major Grants (STS-MG)

Grants between \$10,001 and \$150,000 are available for major commemorative projects and activities that are significant from a national, state, territory and/or broader regional perspective.

Veterans SA Capacity Building Grant

Agency: Veterans Sa – Government of South Australia

Closing: 31 May 2025

Eligibility: Non-government, not-for-profit ex service organisation

The Fund offers support to eligible ex-service organisations to help them improve their governance and strengthen their capacity building skills.

Examples of eligible projects include:

- leadership and governance training for board or committee members
- temporary project staff salaries or consultant costs to assist in developing a plan or strategy (e.g. strategic plan, communication/social media strategy)
- training and skills development (e.g. grant writing skills, volunteer management training, financial management training)
- development of a website or app to make services more accessible to the community.

Applicants can seek grants of up to \$5,000 (ex GST) for projects that help strengthen the governance of ex-service organisations to lead, develop, support and advocate for their communities. A maximum of \$25,000 in grant funding is available for distribution in the 2024-2025 financial year.

Funding can be used for eligible expenses that directly relate to coordination, management and delivery of the project within South Australia.

Veterans SA Commemorative Services Grant Fund

Agency: Government of SA – Veterans SA

Closing: 31 May 2025 unless funds exhausted prior to this date.

Eligibility:

- non-government, not-for-profit
- have a registered Australian Business Number (ABN)
- provide satisfactory evidence that the core purpose is to deliver initiatives, services or support for the South Australian veteran community
- be based in South Australia.

Funding can be used for eligible expenses that directly relate to coordination, management and delivery of commemorative services within South Australia. **Please note grants for Anzac Day Dawn Services are not available through this funding round.**

Applicants can seek grants of up to \$1,000 (ex GST) for expenses that directly relate to the coordination, management and delivery of commemorative services within South Australia. A maximum of \$15,000 in grant funding is available for distribution in the 2024-2025 financial year.

Examples of eligible expenses include:

- venue (hire fees)
- equipment and furniture hire
- catering
- security
- advertising and marketing such as flyers, booklets and posters.

SPORTS AND LEISURE

National Pies for Local Legends

Agency: Tasmanian Bakeries

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility: community group, sporting club or not-for-profit organisation

National Pies will award a grant of \$1,000 each month until March 2025. They will also award a major grant of \$10,000 at the end of the program.

The grants can be used for a variety of projects or equipment.

Clubs for Communities – IGC Sponsorship

Agency: Clubs SA

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility: Non-gaming sporting and community clubs

Projects must be accessible to people from across the State. One application per organisation will be considered in any twelve-month period.

Projects can be a "once off", or over a longer term.

Projects should reflect a high standard of integrity and identify the specific area of the community who will most benefit from assistance.

Preference will be given to causes that:

- can demonstrate assistance to those sectors in the community that are in some manner 'disadvantaged'. For example, priority will be given to projects that support children, young people, physically and/or intellectually disadvantaged people, health-related programs, and community-based projects by not-for-profit organisations.
- benefit a charity or community organisation directly, without going through an intermediary.

Roger Rasheed Sports Foundation

Agency: Roger Rasheed Foundation

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility: Disadvantaged communities

The Roger Rasheed Sports Foundation believes that regular sport activities and on-going training and mentoring can make a positive difference to children in all areas. By revitalising forgotten reserves and rusty old equipment or by building an entirely new precinct, the aim is to provide the children of extreme disadvantaged areas access to sport.

The foundation welcome ideas and interaction from coaches, teachers, parents or anyone who believes sport can be a life changing experience for children and have identified a specific demand.

Sports Vouchers

Agency: Government of South Australia - Office for Recreation Sports and Racing

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility: For children living in South Australia in Reception to Year 9

The Sports Voucher program provides a discount of up to \$200 on sport, dance, learn to swim or scouts/guides fees for children living in South Australia in Reception to Year 9, each calendar year. The aim is to increase the number of children participating in physical activity by helping to reduce cost as a barrier.

ARTS AND CULTURE

Multicultural Festival



Agency: Department of Premier and Cabinet – Government of South Australia

Closing: 18 May 2025

Eligibility: non-government and not-for-profit

- provide satisfactory evidence that their core purpose is to deliver initiatives, services, or support for culturally and linguistically diverse communities in South Australia
- be South Australian based

Grants of \$250 and \$500 are available to support eligible multicultural community organisations to participate in the 2025 Multicultural Festival on Sunday 23 November, 2025.

The Multicultural Festival is the state government’s flagship event for celebrating multiculturalism in South Australia, and a chance for new and established multicultural organisations to showcase their culture through a performance, stall or hosting an activity.

Richard Llewellyn Deaf and Disability Grants



Agency: Create SA – Government of South Australia

Closing: 15 May 2026

Eligibility:

- Individuals who are deaf or identify as a person with disability.
- Groups of artists who are deaf or identify as people with disability.
- Deaf and disability-led arts and cultural organisations (including funded small-to-medium organisations in the disability arts sector).
- Non-deaf and disability-led arts and cultural organisations (funded organisations: small-to-medium organisations, major organisations).

This grant supports increased access to arts and cultural activities for South Australians who are deaf or identify as people with disability. Spanning all art forms, funded activity should contribute to reducing barriers for audiences and participants.

Grants of up to \$10,000 are available. This is a quick response grant category and applications must be discussed with CreateSA staff before submission.

Live Music Events Fund

Agency: Music Development Office – Government of South Australia

Closing: Ongoing EOI. Open each financial year until funds exhausted.

Eligibility: You must be a promoter, event organisation or music business (applicant) seeking financial support from the LMEF to present a major festival and music event (event) in South Australia.

The South Australian Government's LIVE MUSIC Events Fund (LMEF) was created to support live music events and festivals with the potential to grow into major tourist attractions. The Music Development Office (MDO), part of the Creative Industries team of Arts South Australia, at the Department of the Premier and Cabinet, administers the fund in consultation with Events South Australia, a division of the South Australian Tourism Commission (SATC). The Government has committed \$550,000 per year to support music events and festivals through the LMEF.

Objectives

The Live Music Event Fund aims to:

- elevate Adelaide's recognition as a UNESCO City of Music through activating our live music events calendar
- mitigate the financial barriers experienced by promoters in the first two years of staging a new live music event
- attract unique music events to South Australia that generate economic benefit, provide local jobs for musicians and crews, and attract visitors from South Australia's key domestic tourism markets
- provide industry development opportunities or pathways that support the growth of the event into a unique offering for the state that is financially sustainable and not reliant on government funding for viability.

ENVIRONMENT

Bite-sized Grants Program



Agency: Northern and Yorke Landscape Board

Closing: 30 May 2025.

Eligibility: Incorporated not-for-profit groups including, but not limited to Land, Coast, and Bushcare groups, Friends of groups, farming groups and schools.

Eligible projects will contribute to one or more of the priorities of the Northern and Yorke Landscape Board:

- Pest Plant and Animal Control
- Sustainable Agriculture
- Water Management
- Biodiversity
- Communities

Grants are available between \$200 and \$2,000 for on-ground activities such as weed control, revegetation, watercourse restoration, community education, erosion and pest management.

There is a limit of one successful application per group.

Individual landholders cannot apply, although groups of landholders may apply with the support of a sponsor.

COUNCILS

Clare and Gilbert Valleys Council Community Donation

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility: Community Organisations / Charitable Organisations / Special Needs Groups from the Council area

The Community Donation program provides various forms of support, including donations, grants, interest-free loans, and in-kind assistance, to ensure that community-driven projects, and initiatives receive the necessary resources.

It encourages community groups to partner with Council to deliver positive outcomes that benefit the region. Preference is given to local applicants or initiatives that offer direct and benefits to the community. Maximum amount \$3,000.

Clare and Gilbert Valleys Council Special Events

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility: Community Organisations / Charitable Organisations / Special Needs Groups from the Council area

For special community events that have a direct benefit to the local community

These events are classified as “Local Events” being events that are private, small in attendance, primarily local visitors eg: street parties, country markets, Christmas functions, organised and managed locally. Maximum amount \$5,000

Port Pirie Regional Council Community Assistance Fund

Closing: Ongoing (Four rounds per year)

Eligibility: Non-for-profit organisations, community and sporting groups based in the Council area

The purpose of the fund is to encourage and support community initiatives that respond to local needs, enhance community well-being and quality of life and are of benefit to the residents.

It is aimed at providing non-for-profit organisations, community and sporting groups based in the Council area with the opportunity to obtain funds for projects or events which cannot easily be obtained from other sources.

Grant funding of up to a maximum of \$4,000 is available for financial and/or in-kind assistance per application, per organisation, per year.

Applicants may submit one application per funding round.

Regional Council of Goyder Community Events Funding

Closing: Ongoing

Eligibility: Events held within the Council area

Community event funding is available to support events held within the Council area, with broad appeal to both the local and wider community that celebrate significant occasions, encourage cultural diversity or bring communities together.

An [Event Management Plan](#) will need to be provided as part of the application.

This funding is available throughout the year (unless funds for that financial year are exhausted) and will be presented for consideration at the relevant Council meeting.

Wakefield Regional Council Events Sponsorship Grants Program

Closing: Ongoing until budget is expended

Eligibility: Wakefield-based not-for-profit organisations that provide benefit to the Wakefield community.

Wakefield Regional Council's Community Grants Program aims to provide financial support to community not-for-profit organisations to connect people in the region and support delivery of the Wakefield 2030 Community Plan and vision:

Examples:

- Major street activation events
- Town hall productions
- Festivals (non-exclusive) Events that celebrate the region's culture, history and arts
- Events to promote community pride
- Art exhibitions
- Museum events
- Come and try events
- Community markets

Up to \$500 for minor events. Up to \$2,000 for major events.

Yorke Peninsula Council Business Enhancement Program – Business Grant

Closing: Ongoing until budget is expended

Eligibility: Yorke Peninsula Council based business.

The funding may be used for investment in new equipment or infrastructure, production of marketing and promotional materials, IT equipment installation and software development, training or conference attendance, mentoring and networking opportunities, etc. Any proposal that will boost the local economy will be considered under this grant funding.

If funding is being sought, you will be required to 'match' the funding as follows:

- For grants up to \$2,500 (GST exclusive) – For each \$1 granted, applicants are expected to contribute a matching \$1 towards the project. E.g., the applicant contributes \$2,000 and seeks \$2,000 from the business grant for the project's total costs of \$4,000 (GST exclusive).
- For grants over \$2,500 (capped at \$10,000) (GST exclusive) – For each \$1 granted, applicants are expected to contribute a minimum of \$1 towards the project; however, a greater co-contribution may be required (e.g., \$2 contribution from applicants for \$1 granted).
